15. The fundamental platform on which Hitler built his support was the notion of the **racial Superiority** of the Germans as a pure, 'Aryan' race and a deep seated hatred of the **Jews**
16. In **October 1922**, in the context of a long ministerial crisis, Mussolini organized the **Fascist March on Rome**
17. Ramalinga emphasized the bonds of **responsibility** and **compassion** between living beings. He established **Samarasa Vedha Sanmarga** Sangam in 1865.
18. Under the Lucknow Pact (1916), the **Congress** and the **Muslim League** agreed that there should be **self – government** in India as soon as possible.
19. The **Battle of Marne** is a memorable for trench warfare. **Trenches or ditches** dug by troops enabled soldiers to safely stand and protect themselves from enemy fire.
20. It is the concept and practice of reducing disaster risks through **systematic efforts** to analyze and reduce the **casual factors** of disasters.

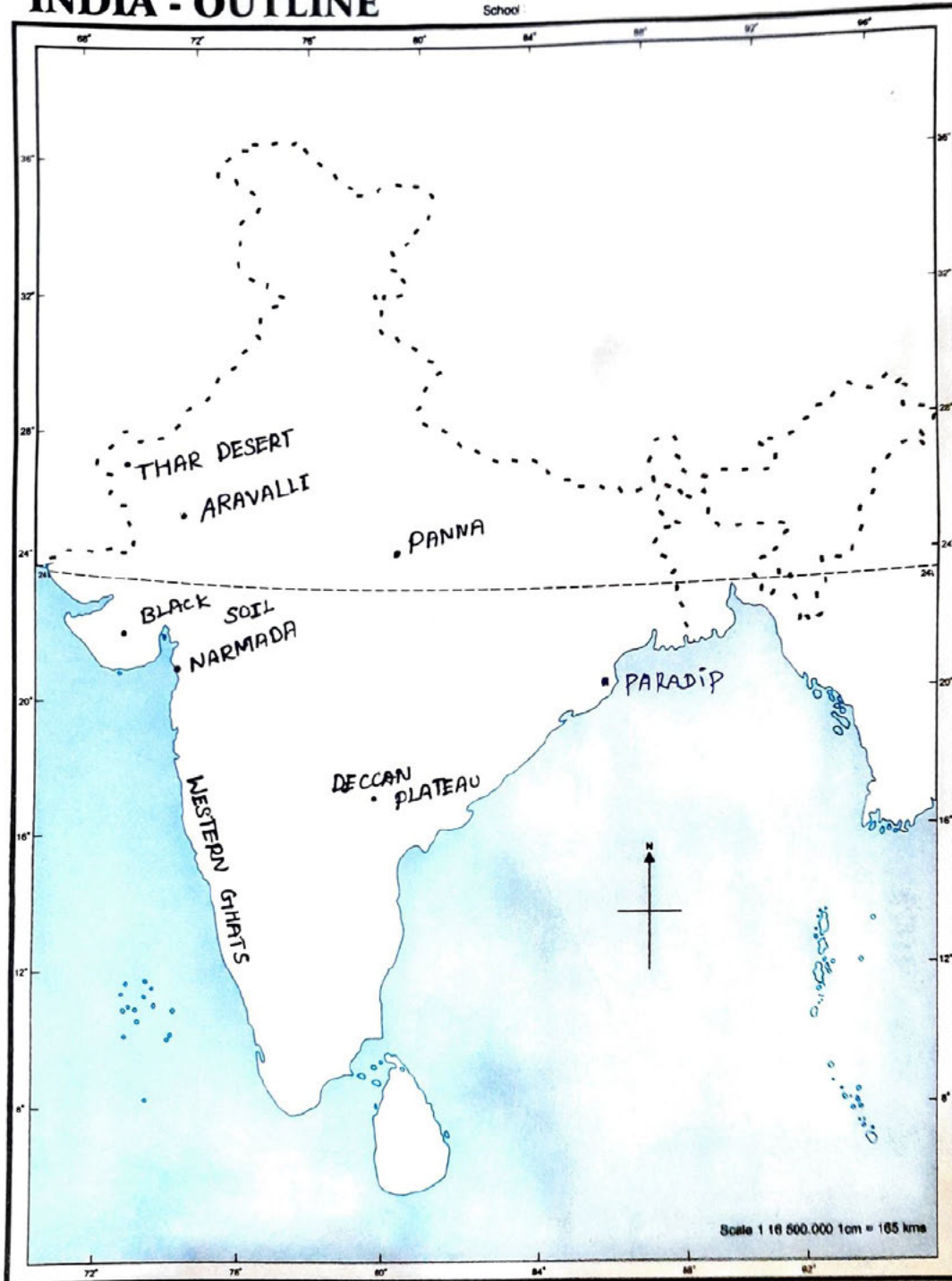

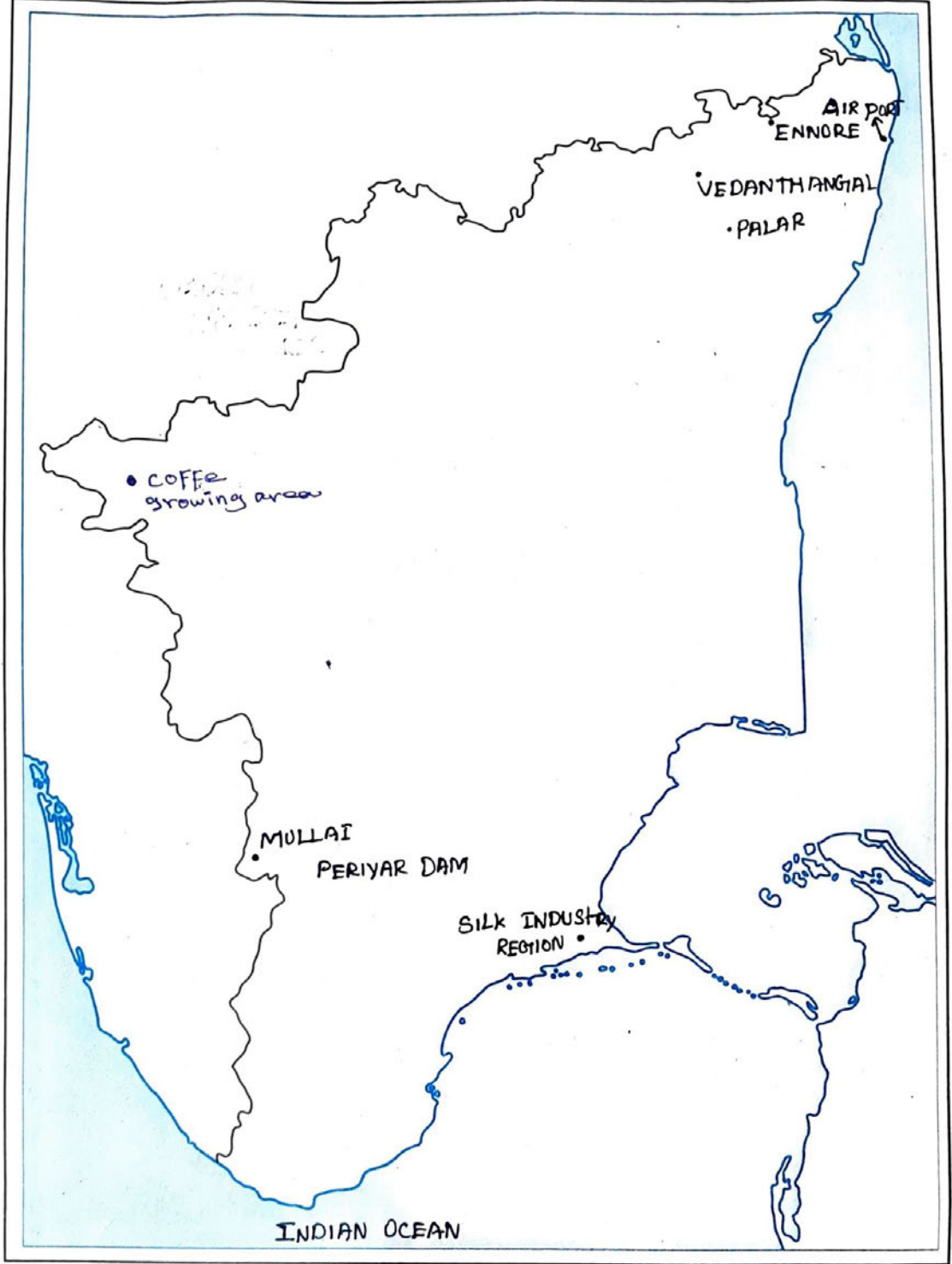
